"Delicate but complex aroma, lightly leesy and mealy/ creamy though the citrus fruit is zesty and bright, almost a little peachy. A step up from the Valmur but

still does not have great intensity for Les Clos. Dry finesse on the finish, hence the rather conservative suggested drink dates for a Chablis grand cru."

2011 VINTAGE

"Shiny gold. The oak aromas are still quite present. In the mouth, a nice juicy roundness. It may seem a bit too muscular with its vanilla notes and butter notes, but it is elegant and has a nice juice. A wine crafted with modern techniques, whose oaky character should soften with time and that would certainly allow it to obtain one point or even more."

One star for Les Clos 2007, two stars and a favorite choice for 2009. Chanson has found its mark in Chablis. This Grand Cru is a true example of elegance and purity. The nose is subtle and displays aromas of dried fruit and white flowers. On the palate, the wine is appealing displaying power, roundness, and minerality with an array of spices, including vanilla and cinnamon. A well balanced wine, the perfect match for chicken with morels. This wine will be at its peak in four or five years. 2
